Doug, a former two-term Long Beach City Councilman, Vice Mayor and Police Department Commander, has been named to the Long Beach Board of Harbor Commissioners, the five-member governing body for the Port of Long Beach, California. He currently serves as the Board's President.

JIM has had an over fifty year career with Long Beach's largest accounting firm now known as Windes, Inc. He joined the firm initially in 1962, became a partner in 1969 and spent 11 years as the Managing Partner.

In his partial retirement JIM continues to act as a trustee for some of his clients. In addition to being a CPA, he is also a Certified Financial Planner. In 1984 JIM was appointed by California's Governor to a four year term on the State Board of Accountancy. He was elected in both 1985 and 1986 to serve as Board President and was appointed to a second term on the Board in 1988.

He was appointed by Long Beach Mayor Bob Foster and unanimously confirmed by the City Council in August 2011. Under the Long Beach City Charter, the Board of Harbor Commissioners is responsible for setting policy for the Port and managing the Harbor Department.



Mr. Drummond concluded his service as a member of the City of Long Beach Civil Service Commission in 2011 to accept the Harbor Commission appointment. He has also served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Long Beach Transportation Company, the public transit unit of the City of Long Beach (2010-2011), and as California State Commissioner for the Board of Parole Hearings (2008-2009). In addition, he was appointed by Supervisor Don Knabe to serve as Fish & Game Commissioner for Los Angeles County (2003-2007).

His Third District constituents elected him to the Long Beach City Council in 1990, and Mr. Drummond served two four-year terms (1990-1998) on the Council, two of those years as Vice Mayor (1994-95, 1995-96).

As noted in the Press-Telegram recently, JIM is now the President of Edgar Rice Burroughs, Inc., marketing internationally recognized copyrights and trademarks. While creating both Tarzan of The Apes and John Carter of Mars, Burroughs wrote over 70 novels and 40 short stories and sold more books and spawned more movies than all the great writers of the first half of the 20th Century combined. His popularity continues to this day.



JIM's civic activities include Past Chairman of the Long Beach Area Chamber of Commerce and of the Governing Board of the City of Long Beach/County of Los Angeles Civic Center Authority. Currently he is a member of the Board of Governors of the LBCC Foundation and is a Founder of the Long Beach Community Foundation. He also serves as Chairman of the Board of International City Bank. JIM was President of the Downtown Lions Club in 1976-77.

JIM and his wife Vickie have two adult children: Gina, a Veterinarian in Santa Barbara and owner of the Cat Doctors, and JIM, a film director and creative director of PTTOW, a member only innovative marketing network and summit.
