ROGER has been an active Downtown Lion since transferring to this club from the Belmont Shore Lions Club in 1995. For two years, 1997-1999, he was the club's Director of Membership. After serving a year as First Vice President, he was elected President for 2001-2002. ROGER was our District Governor for 2005-6 and was the Multiple District 4-California Chair in 2006-2007. He is presently state coordinator for the Lions Clubs International Foundation, overseeing fifteen district coordinators. He has also served as our District's Parliamentarian/Protocol Officer, a member of the Constitution and By-Laws committee, President of the Lions Eye Foundation of So.
