

As a graduate of Harvard Law School, Jean was a practicing attorney in LA before deciding that she wanted to do something professionally that was more

rewarding and had higher social value. In 1998, she was appointed by then-Mayor Beverly O'Neill to a City-led strategic planning effort that would chart the way to what stakeholders wanted the City to look like in 2010. She served as Chair of the Strategic Plan's Education and Youth Task Force. Input the task force received identified several items crucial to youth success, including mentoring, after school programming and



increasing the number of LBUSD graduates who attended college.

In 2000, Jean founded Long Beach BLAST, a nonprofit organization to address those issues. Since then, BLAST has provided more than 12,000 college

students who mentor at-risk, LBUSD students, helping them succeed academically and to set goals for their future, including a college education.

Currently, Jean serves as the Executive Director of Long Beach CaLL, a nonprofit created as part of the College Promise to help students be ready for college and career success when they graduate.

On Feb. 3, Jean will share how the LB Lions Club can partner with LB schools to make sure that local students succeed when they enter the local workforce.
