STEVE was born in Redondo Beach, CA and grew up in Lomita. He moved to North Long Beach in 1999 and then to Lakewood in 2002. He moved back to Lomita in

City Prosecutor in 2010, and then re-elected in 2014 by 74% of the vote. He began his legal career as a Deputy City Prosecutor in Long Beach. He later joined a prominent municipal law firm, eventually becoming a partner of the firm while serving as City Prosecutor and City Attorney to several cities in Southern California.

Another grant is devoted to fighting gangs engaged in sex trafficking of women and assisting the victims with social services so they can recover from the trauma of sex trafficking.

He also earned an MBA from CSULB. He won awards with the Students in Free Enterprise Club and Delta Epsilon Ki competitive business club. STEVE was awarded the Senate Star from LBCC for achievements while on student senate. He also garnered the Presidential Student Service award presented by then President George W Bush.



STEVE worked in the movie industry for many years as an electrician and grip. He has managed an aftermarket Harley Davidson shop and run a live event and video production company for about 7 years. He is currently owner of Big Bob's Parts; buying selling and restoring vintage high performance auto parts.

Besides Lions, STEVE is active in the Ventura County Standdown and a Veterans committee board member in California Employers Advisory Council. He has been awarded a Veterans Advocate of the Year award for 2014.
